

CHRISTIAN LEADERS PROGRAM

The Leadership Institute's Christian Leaders Program activates a new generation of conservative Christians to engage meaningfully with the political process and contend for their principles, the very principles upon which America was founded.

Your Leadership Institute first identifies conservative Christian leaders on college campuses by building relationships through LI's existing national network of conservative student groups. In addition, your Leadership Institute works with Christian professors to identify promising students.

Your Leadership Institute then recruits those students into the program and works to match their career goals and aspirations with the broad array of Leadership Institute resources.

Through training, one-on-one mentorship, and ongoing support, your Leadership Institute helps young Christian leaders learn how to work in politics on behalf of their faith.

The Christian Leaders Program also connects students to networking, internship, and job opportunities throughout the conservative and Christian movements.

The Christian Leaders Program is managed by Amanda Spiers, who is herself a strong conservative Christian leader.

In June 2023, Amanda will launch the capstone of the Christian Leaders Program: the Christian Statesmen Conference. This event will bring together dozens of the top young Christian leaders from across the country for an intensive course on politics, organizational leadership, and networking.

Through the Christian Leaders Program, the Leadership Institute activates conservative Christians and accelerates their development into the future leaders of the conservative movement and of the country.


Hometown: Del Mar Beach, California

LIBERTY UNIVERSITY - LYNCHBURG, VA


Hometown: Seattle, Washington

The speakers included Jerimiah Loring, Deputy Director of Generation Joshua, who spoke to the students about biblical principles in American history, and Calvin Baylock, Chief of Staff for Invictus Strategies, who spoke about faith in the workplace.

The students also learned about the important role that faith plays in the life of the nation. The attendees visited the Museum of the Bible in Washington, DC, where they learned how the message of the gospel permeates American culture. They attended the Faith and Freedom

Coalition's Road to Majority Conference, where they witnessed what actively fighting for Christian principles in politics looks like in practice.

The keynote speaker of LI's Christian Statesman Conference was Riley Gaines, the conservative activist and former NCAA athlete. Riley (above) shared with the students her story about standing up for what is right and what is true even when no one else will. She also spoke about how her Christian faith plays a strong role in her activism. A recent college graduate herself, Riley provides an excellent role model for these young Christian Leaders.

The experience and skills gained from this week-long conference will allow these young Christian Leaders to be witnesses for the gospel on their campuses and in the workplace.
